Welcome, everyone! We are so happy to be working with you and your children. Thank you for completing the paperwork. For your convenience, there is a tray in the hall outside the large classroom for enrollment forms, medical forms, parent handbook forms, permission slips, email addresses, tuition agreements and fundraiser forms. We appreciate you returning the completed forms as soon as possible. If your address, phone number or emergency contacts change during the school year, please keep us updated. If you use your cell phone as an emergency number, please keep it turned on while your child is in school.

IMPORTANT CHECK INFO: If you pay your tuition by check, please be aware that our bank has enacted a policy for returned checks. Here is their official wording: “If your check is returned for non-sufficient funds, you expressly authorize your account to be electronically debited or bank drafted for the amount of the check plus any applicable fees. The use of a check for payment is your acknowledgment and acceptance of this policy and its terms and conditions.”

A WORD ABOUT FEET: Our students are very active during their days at MEEC. They climb and run on the playground, use balance beams and move around a lot in the gym. To be safe and able to participate in all activities, we are requesting that children wear tennis shoes. Please save the sandals and Crocs for times when your child is not at MEEC. Please dress them in washable play clothes, because sometimes we get messy!
